Overall Club and Individual Divisional Championships

EVENTS

There will be eight championship rounds shot each calendar year. These rounds will consist of 2 x Target, 2 x Indoor (18 and 25 Metres), 2 x Field (24 Marked WA Field), and 2 x Clout.

Target

The target rounds will be the same as those shot at the National Championships as described in Chapter 3, Championships, Archery Australia Shooting Rules. For example, recurve open men shoot a WA 90/1440 round, and compound women shoot a WA 70/1440 round

Indoor

The indoor round will consist of 60 arrows at 25m (Australian Indoor 2) and 60 arrows at 18m (Australian Indoor 1). These will be treated as two separate events and points awarded/placing will be determined according to the Grand Master Bowman rating for each round, then added together to obtain the final points/placing. An Australian Indoor 1 and an Australian Indoor 2 shot on different days cannot be used to calculate best results for indoor placing. They must be shot on the same day.

Clout

The two rounds used to determine points awarded/placing in the clout event must be shot on the same day and distances shot will be as per Archery Australia Competition Regulations Chapter 12, Clout Archery.

Field

The two field rounds will consist of a 24 marked WA field round and will be shot in accordance with Archery Australia Competition Regulations, Chapter 11, and Book 4 of WA Constitution and Rules.

RESTRICTIONS

Archers are permitted to submit results for the overall club championship for one division and one bow type only in any calendar year. The first club championship event an archer shoots will determine the division and bow type for that year's overall club championship and individual divisional competition for the archer.

DETERMINATION OF FINISHING POSITION

To make allowance for the divisions, the following rating system will apply. Each archer will be allocated a rating dependent upon his or her division. This will be the Grand Master Bowman rating as per Schedule 4.A of the Archery Australia Rules Book.

For each archer an adjusted rating will be calculated based on:

Adjusted championships rating = archer's rating on the day/GBM rating *100%.
The finishing order for the event is determined from the decreasing order of the adjusted championships rating, i.e. the archer with the highest adjusted rating will be the winner in Target, Indoor and Field. In the clout event the GMB rating is common to all divisions therefore the finishing order will be in decreasing order of the off the bow scores.

Below is an example for the target event.

Each archer's best off the bow score for each discipline (ie, Target, Field, Indoor & Clout) will be used to determine their finishing position for each discipline. Archers will during the calendar year have the opportunity to submit two scores for each discipline, with the best being used to determine their finishing position in each discipline.

POINT ALLOCATION

Points will be allocated according to finishing position in each of the four disciplines as follows.

and then continuing to decrease by three points for each placing thereafter.

Overall Club Championship

To be eligible for the Overall Club Championship an archer must submit at least one score in all four disciplines. If an archer submits more than one score for each discipline, the best off the bow score will be used to calculate placing within the division. The archer with the highest number of points from the four disciplines will be declared overall club champion. Second and third placing will also be awarded.

In the event of a tie, dual champions will be awarded, and then third place. In the event of a tie for second, first place will be awarded, then dual second place, and no third place. If there is a tie for third then first and second and dual third place will be awarded.

Individual Division Championship

To be eligible for individual divisional championships, eg, Cadet Recurve Women or Masters Compound Male, an archer must submit at least one score in all four disciplines. If an archer submits more than one score for each discipline, the best off the bow score will be used to calculate placing within the division.

Within each division as specified in the Archery Australia Rules, first, second and third will be awarded to those archers who have submitted at least one score in all four disciplines. In the event of a tie for any placing the same process as for Overall Club Championship will apply.
